Articles from Parish Councillors

Update on the **Picnic Fields and Salter's Field**

The Picnic Field is situated beyond Radlett Cricket Club's second pitch and next to the railway, at the southern end of King George V Playing Fields on Cobden Hill. Over five years ago, discussions started with the local Police and Hertsmere Borough Council about the granting of a lease to a specifically-created body for it to operate a motor bike training facility on the Picnic Field. Subsequent developments have been protracted. Reasons for the delays include the need to consult with local residents, the need to obtain planning permission, the need for finance to be raised and ongoing changes in the personnel involved with the various parties. After much effort on the part of the body set up to construct and operate the facility, it was recently concluded that the project would have to be aborted. It has not been possible to reach agreement with the owners of the track leading from Watling Street to the Picnic Field, for access to be guaranteed to potential users.

During this process contractors working for Network Rail, entered the Picnic Field without permission and caused considerable damage. Network Rail has since provided the Parish Council with funds either to create the proposed bike

The Parish Council will now use those funds to remove the front fence and gate, recently erected by Network Rail, and to clear the Picnic Field of all the rubble and restore it to its former state.

A report on the Parish Council's plans to develop the Wellhouse Dell and Salter's Field areas of King Gorge V Playing Fields was provided in the spring edition of Around Radlett (on page 11 of edition 94). A presentation was also given at the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council in March. There is nothing new to report. It is still our intention to proceed with the project without partners. Initial soundings are now being taken on the likelihood of obtaining the necessary planning permissions. If they look to be encouraging, we will seek tenders from contractors to: infill the Dell using inert landfill material and reclaim the land; extend the existing car park; landscape the area and plant new trees; construct a new access road and, if finances permit, create new sports pitches on the reclaimed Dell and levelled Salter's Field. Tenderers will be expected to bear all costs and provide a financial contribution to the Parish Council. The project should be self-financing. Tenderers will gain income from the infilling of the Dell and importation of inert material onto Salter's. as part of the levelling programme.

The importation of landfill material and the construction work will bring an increase of heavy traffic into the area and will restrict access to Salter's in the short term. This inconvenience will need to be balanced against the ultimate benefits: a much more attractive and useable area for walkers, runners and dog walkers, with the possibility of more sports pitches: a bigger car park: and a better and a safer access road for vehicles.

There are many surveys that will have to be carried out as part of the planning process. The project is not without risk and a full risk analysis will be carried out in due course. We are at a very early stage of what could be a very long process. We will consult and advise at all appropriate stages.

Neighbourhood Plans

We need your involvement.

The new Localism Act incorporates the ability of a Parish Council to create a Neighbourhood Plan if it feels that the Borough Local Plan does not sufficiently deal with the specific concerns of the residents of the Parish.

As Chair of the Parish Council Planning Committee, I am aware of various local concerns about plans which are passed against the wishes of the local residents, but which do not specifically contravene the existing planning laws. A Neighbourhood Plan should give us the ability to incorporate into Planning Law factors which will improve the amenity of our area and which, if passed, will have to be taken into account by the Planning Appeal Inspectors.

The process of forming a Neighbourhood Plan is not easy and takes a considerable time, but will be worth the effort to have a neighbourhood that residents want.

We plan to consult with the Borough Council and residents over the next few months.

However, initially we would like to create a list of people who have an opinion on what the local needs are. Olympic Torch Bearer

"Just over 30 years ago aged 12, I was diagnosed with Crohn's an incurable inflammatory bowel disease. Currently recovering from bowel transplant, have received the wonderful. humbling honour of being an Olympic Torch Bearer.

My journey has had many highs and lows. The highs being the support of my incredible wife, Justine and three wonderful kids Aaron, Nathan and Lauren. But my lows have included over 20 operations, intestinal failure and a life on intravenous feed.

October 2011, I became the 11th patient to undergo bowel transplant at The Churchill Hospital in Oxford. Whilst there I received the news that I had been nominated as a Torch Bearer. My date is 8th July in Welwyn with precise details known only a month before.

My nomination was for my work in raising funds for research into finding a cure for Crohn's. Over the years, with the help of others, I have raised over £300,000. I have recently become Chairman of the charity Crohns and Colitis in Childhood (www.3Cs.org.uk), and our biggest fundraiser is our Paris2London bike ride in July. I have lived in Radlett for over 20 years. I am very proud that I am able to represent the community in this way."

Radlett Rotary Five Fields Fun Runs and Walk

This year there will be the usual two running events, plus a NEW "fun walk", making it open to absolutely everyone. Both runs start from the Tabard Rugby Club grounds, off Cobden Hill, and will be totally off-road. The 5km event also involves running through the 2 adjacent cricket club grounds, the Rose Field and also Salters Field, making five fields in total – hence the name!

- The shorter run of 1.5 km will start at 10.00 am and is for anyone under the age of 11. For very young children in this event, we would request that a parent accompanies them. Cost: £4 This will be followed by the longer run of 5 km, for those aged 7 and over, starting at 10.30 am. Cost: £6
- The 5 km walk takes place at the same time as the 5 km run, and starts from the same location. It is designed to be suitable for families and individuals and will also feature a short quiz to be completed as you go round, for which there will be a small prize for the winners.

What happened in Radlett during the Queen's Coronation?

Extract from Herts Advertisers supplement dated June 5 1953

"A United open-air service on the Phillimore Recreation Ground on Sunday was the beginning of the festivities at Radlett. Over 700 people assembled for the service at which standards of Aldenham and District Branch of the British Legion, the RAF Association and the Scouts were carried.

A procession from the pavilion, which was used as a robing room, was headed by the Cross of Christ Church, carried by Mr George Hussey and followed by the robed choirs of Christ Church and the Congregational Church, Rev W K Blackburn, Rev D E Cook, Rev K MacFarlane Harley and the Rev R A Wilkinson. The procession also included members of the Aldenham Parish Council and local representatives of Herts County Council and Watford Rural District Council.

A platform had been erected at the far end of the recreation ground and seats provided for elderly people. The congregation was accompanied during the service by the Band of St Albans Salvation Army.

The service was opened by the Congregational Minister, Rev McFarlane Harley and the lesson was read by Rev Cook, curate at Christ Church. The Intersession was given by Rev Wilkinson the Methodist Minister. A short address was given by the Vicar, who also conducted a united act of dedication and gave the blessing.

The Vicar said it was right that residents of Radlett should share in the Coronation 'and prepare for it together, not only by keeping high festival but by holding a unified act of worship.'

'We know the Queen has been well schooled for the position she now holds; we rejoice that she possesses a fine, upright Christian character', her home and family life is one which we admire greatly. But she remains an ordinary human person, subject to all the temptation and trials common to mankind.'

'She has been called to assume the throne of her father at a time when the world situation daunts even the bravest spirit.'

'Moreover, like all those who hold positions of public responsibility, the searchlight of



publicity follows every move she makes. We expect much of her and she surely has the right to expect as much from us'.

Parents and children from Cragg Avenue, Willow Way and Gills Hill Lane, who had been collecting for some weeks for a children's party, were determined that the youngsters should not be disappointed on Tuesday when rain made it impossible to hold the function, as planned, in the open air. Eager volunteers helped transfer the whole party to the Congregational hall and in spite of the rain over 100 children spent a happy afternoon and evening.

Over £26 was collected to pay for the party and mothers in the district made cakes, pastries and sandwiches for tea. Planned as a party for the children, both young and old were invited, and parents and grandparents joined in the fun.

A fancy dress competition opened the proceedings, the judges being Mr and Mrs E S Hanlon. A bouquet was presented to Mr Hanlon by Elaine Green. Tea was followed bny ice cream, games and the gift of a souvenir mug for every child with the present of a shilling in the form of a new and an old sixpence.

Tea was serviced by parents and music for games was provided by Mrs Margery Dumican (piano) and Mr R Hall (accordion).

Keep Radlett Moving

The Parish Council have for some time been looking to improve the parking issues in Radlett, and in 2010 formed the 'Keep Radlett Moving' working party.

The group agreed that the following were the main points;

Issues

- Drivers waiting in the service road for a parking space to become available, thus causing a tailback of traffic and blocking the roundabout at the bottom of Shenley Hill
- Delivery lorries blocking the service road and parking in the bus bay and on the pavement
- Parking on the access road to the • car park
- Able-bodied drivers parking in disabled bays and sufficency of disabled bays
- Drivers who have no business there parking in the Radlett Centre spaces (and in the Village Institute's car park)

Facts

- Parking in the Newberries Parade shoppers car park is free for the first hour
- There are eight disabled bays along Watling Street - two outside the Oakway shops, one outside Lumleys, one outside Barclays Bank and four in the service road
- The no entry sign at the entry/exit point half-way along the service road prevents/deters larger delivery vehicles from accessing the rear of the shops and forces all drivers using the service road to access it by the war memorial

Possible solutions

- Limit parking on the service road to disabled (as now) and to half-hour or one hour only - to encourage short stay only (stop and drop or pick-up) and stop long stay (hair, nails, dentist, opticians, etc)
- Increase number and width of disabled bays
- Improve signage for Newberries Parade car park and emphasise one hour free
- Improve signage at entry to access • road - No Waiting, Parking Limited to

half-hour/one hour, Disabled Parking, No Unloading between specified hours

- Remove the no entry sign in the middle of the service road
- Ensure the traffic wardens are targeting:
 - Cars without tickets or over time
 - Cars in disabled bays without badges
 - Cars waiting and therefore obstructing traffic
 - Cars parked on the access road to the car park
 - Delivery lorries causing an obstruction
- Review traffic warden statistics
- Research with Hertsmere / police over the actions that can be taken against unauthorised parkers at the Radlett Centre
- Improve signage re parking restrictions

Aldenham Parish Council has been in talks with Hertsmere BC, Herts CC and Tesco regarding these issues and the possible solutions. Further talks with shopkeepers are planned.

Some progress has been made; Hertsmere BC has changed the charging structure in front of the shops at Newberries Parade, which should encourage short term and discourage longer term parking.

Aldenham Parish Council continues to fund the first hour free of Newberries Car Park.

Tesco have agreed to reduce the number of delivery vehicles and to move the times of their delivery lorries to early morning, keeping disruption to a minimum.

Aldenham Parish Council is still pressing Hertsmere BC to increase the number of disabled parking spaces at Newberries Parade

At the Radlett Centre, Aldenham Parish Council has improved the signage to show spaces for authorised users only. The next step is to employ a company to police this use.

National Science and Engineering Week at Fair Field Junior School – 12th March 2012

Professor John Kelly's key note talk on immunisation

National Science and Engineering Week got off to a terrific start at Fair Field Junior School during the first assembly of the week with an excellent talk from Professor John Kelly on vaccination. With humour and the use of some fine graphics, Professor Kelly took the children on a journey through the history, science and even some of the controversies surrounding immunisation. There were lots of interesting facts about life expectancy 200 years ago compared to today and how the science of immunisation was based on the singular observation that milking maids, exposed to cowpox through their work, did not develop the much more deadly disease of smallpox.

The engagement with the children throughout all the year groups was great, encouraged by the prize of a pen for every child who answered one of his questions. Both simple and complex questions were answered with great enthusiasm by children from all years. School governors visiting the school the following day were most impressed by the children's understanding and retention of the facts and concepts introduced by Professor Kelly.

Land Yachts Project 2012





Fair Field School eagerly embraced the activities organised for National Science and Engineering Week by teacher Miss Clancy and parents Mrs Kelly and Mrs Branigan.

Over a four week period every child in school built their own model land yachts, which had to travel in a straight line when powered by the wind. All chassis and masts were built from scratch by each child.

Once the chassis and masts were complete, sails were constructed by the children for their science investigation: what shape

and size could best capture the wind in order to make their yacht travel the fastest? A huge range of sail material and rigging were available which allowed the pupils to express their creative design skills. The children were encouraged to think about how their sail designs could use the wind to propel their yachts fastest in the forthcoming racing competition. During construction children tested their designs and thought about ways to improve them.

When all yachts were complete each class held a race-off in the hall. A row of ten desk fans were activated simultaneously to supply a wall of wind to power the yachts over a 5 metre course. The winner from each class then entered the grand final in front of the whole school at Friday assembly.

At assembly the children were asked to explore and discuss the similarities between sails used in the winning designs in terms of weight, height, width and stability.





The final was an exciting occasion. The children and staff lined up either side of the race arena, cheering for their favourite as the fans were turned on and the eight yachts raced swiftly over the course. It was a tight race with the lead changing hands several times. The winning yacht was designed by Joseph from 4C, but well done to all the children for making some truly great looking and imaginative land yachts.

It was an exceptional race to round off a great 4 weeks of

effort and the children agreed that they had very much enjoyed the activities organised for Science and Engineering week. This could not have been possible without the great effort and enthusiasm of Mrs Branigan and Mrs Kelly, to whom we owe a big thank you!

Amendment to the Footpaths Walk Booklet

WALK 4 – WOOD HALL FARM The anticipated re-routing of

public rights of way in the area indicated on the map by a dashed rectangle has now been implemented. A new restricted byway has been approved and the public can no longer use the footpath to the north east of Wood Hall Farm. This means that the directions in 4 needs amendment as follows:

4 Go straight ahead following a path between a ditch and fence to a kissing gate. A white house can be seen on the top of the hill to the right. Go through the kissing gate and head straight on over a bridge and through a wood. Continue along the path to a finger post, marked FP7, by a kissing gate. Turn left over the ditch and immediately right. Follow the path up the slope and along the edge of the field to a road. Turn left onto Woodhall Lane and walk past the entrance to Wood Hall farm.

Copies of the above amendments together with a modified map can be collected free of charge from Aldenham Parish Council office.
