- Shaded areas (slides get really hot in sun)
- Dangerous roundabout (flush to ground) / dangerous big slide (big gaps)
- Matting under equipment trip hazard. Something under zip wire if they fall off
- Gate breaks / hate that there's 2 gates either end (safety) gate can be opened too easily by children
- Older children hanging around at night the castles can get broken glass or other dangerous/off-putting rubbish in and around them
- More lights
